Letters, Notes and Emails ...

Friends,

When Western Ontario Waterways Regional Council formed in 2019, we were asked to write a Living Faith Story – a story to be updated annually and used in place of a needs assessment to call a new minister. Then the pandemic arrived, and it felt far more important to focus our energy on caring for our congregations than on documenting our story. Over the years, I have gathered pictures and ideas for a slideshow that might one day tell that story, but it always seemed that living our story mattered more than telling it.

Now, as I prepare to retire, priorities have shifted. I shared a draft of our story with the Board this week, and what a joy it was to remember all that we have shared over the past 13 years. It has been a profound privilege to serve with you.

Together, we have worshipped in our beautifully decorated sanctuaries and in circles. We have sung together, shared in conversation, and been blessed by the beautiful music of our organists, choirs, bell and chime choirs, band, and ensembles. We have shared in breakfasts, lunches, dinners, picnics, and take-out. Our fundraisers have been creative and fun – country markets, food fights, auctions, food fixes, trivia lunches, Robbie Burns suppers, growing competitions, zucchini races and more.

We have collected food, spirit bundle items, snacks, bikes, and more to help our local partners – AO, ECM, EWCS, RWSP, Royal City Mission and the Rainbow Chorus. Through Mission and Service, the Children of Bukati, Canadian Foodgrains Bank and Guatemala trips, we have supported people across Canada and around the world. With our neighbours we have worshipped on the World Day of Prayer, Good Friday, Remembrance Day and for United Church anniversaries – heard moderators and celebrated our shared faith. Through GERSP we shared in sponsoring the Al Ahmad, Al Janoud family.

We learned to worship on Zoom to stay connected during the pandemic and can now pivot online easily for storms, meetings, and events. Through the Harvest Table, the Wellness Series, and by providing space for AA, EarlyON, and East Wellington Community Services, we have reached out to our communities. Bible Study, the Genesis Book Club, Weeks of Guided Prayer, Spiritual Saturdays, Faith Food Friendship and Fun, UCW, Into the Promise, and Confirmation classes have nurtured our spirits. Coffee Connections, Tea and Talk, Garden Tours, Talent Nights, and other events have deepened our sense of community. And we became the first affirming pastoral charge.

Thank you for the faithful journey we have shared. As God calls us to travel new paths, I pray your lives will continue to be enriched as you live your story as Jesus' faithful followers, making a difference in your communities and the world.

Rockwood and Stone Worship and Faith Formation

During the summer and on the occasional Sunday when Heather has had other commitments, she has been especially appreciative for the Contemplation and Conversation pieces contributed by Barb Eley, Barb Parker, Brian Mack, Lisa Leffler, Karen Richardson, Tammy Smits, and Rosslyn Bentley.

Worship, Learning and Other Activities

- **May 4** – Heather used the WOWRC Spring Meeting Resources including Rev. Dyanne Marlok's reflection for worship.
- **May 25** – The prayers of the people included slides which focused on Rogation Sunday.
- **June 1 – Rockwood's 158th Anniversary** – At the combined service at 10 am. Rev. Andrew Hyde was the guest speaker. The Rockwood Choir sang *Benediction*. Worship was followed by a potluck lunch.
- **June 8 – Celebration of the 100th Anniversary of United Church of Canada** – Nine people from Rockwood and 23 people from Stone joined the cluster gathering at Melville UC in Fergus at 10 am. Rockwood and Stone members sang in the choir, Heather and the other clergy led worship and Lisa Leffler and Rev. Tom Watson spoke. There were over 300 people in worship from the 11 cluster congregations.
- **June 15** – During the week it was decided to hold one service at Stone, as many people from Rockwood were away. Heather Blair played for worship which included communion. Heather focused on inclusion and shared the Moderator's 2025 Pride message.
- **June 22** – Worship and Faith Formation led the service. Rosslyn Bentley and Chris Barlow shared their slides from the Camino that had been planned for March 30.
- **Summer Services** began at Rockwood on June 22. Lisa Leffler led worship on June 29, July 6, July 13, August 24 and August 31.
- **September 7** – The final combined service and picnic were held at Leffler's in St. Jacob's. The service included a craft and other elements from Faith, Food, Friendship and Fun. Heather shared that she will be retiring at the end of June 2026.
- **September 21** – Both congregations were invited to an 80th Birthday Potluck for Carol Stiles following Rockwood's worship.
- **September 28 – Orange Shirt Sunday** – Eleanor Mackenzie Precepa, daughter of Erin Leahey and Robbie Precepa was baptized at Stone. Randy Dewey played guitar and led the choir in singing *Jesus Loves Me*. The congregation was invited to join the family for fellowship after worship.
- **October 5 – World Communion Sunday** – A variety of breads and juice were served.
- **October 12 – Thanksgiving Sunday**
- **October 19 – Stone's 163 Anniversary/World Food Sunday** with Worship focussing on Foodgrains with Bill Allen sharing his ambassador message. After worship, there was a Foodgrains wrap-up followed by lunch. At 1 pm, the Rainbow Chorus joined us to present a mini concert.
- **October 26 – Reformation Sunday**
- **November 9 – Remembrance Sunday** was held at Rockwood at 10 am with the combined choir singing.
- **November 11 – Remembrance Day Service** – Members of the Rockwood and at Stone choirs sang at the cenotaph.

Rockwood Stone Ministry and Personnel

- Ministry and Personnel met on November 3rd at 7 pm at Stone Church. Highlights of the meeting were as follows:
- Noting the change in Chair from Brian Mack to Rosslyn Bentley effective July 2025 and the resignation of Patty Lancaster from the committee effective October 2025.
- Acknowledgement of Rev. Heather Leffler’s letter of October 23rd, 2025 providing notice to retire in

effect from June 30th, 2026. M and P will provide support to the Minister as outlined in the United Church Pastoral Relations December 2019 handbook and Resources for Retirement December 2021 in preparation for retirement and disengagement from the congregation to allow for a successful transition.

- Annual reviews were completed with all staff: Heather Leffler – Patty and Rosslyn; Lisa – Heather DeJonge; Liz Guthrie – Patty, Heather Blair – Ellen Thomson, Barb Eley – Rosslyn. All staff reported satisfaction in their role and with their compensation. Edie and Jack Ward – Patty Lancaster – it was noted they are retiring and Stone Council is reviewing how the duties can be divided to allow for others to support the work. The meeting expressed their sincere appreciation for their many gifts and hard work.
- 2.6% cost of Living minimum adjustments for staff salary were noted from the United Church recommendations and recommended to the joint Board along with an increase in the education allowance to \$1762, mileage of \$0.60/km, \$261 for pulpit supply and \$40/month phone allowance for the Minister (although it is noted the Western Ontario Waterways RC recommended minimum rate is \$50/month).
- The following Motion was approved: to recommend to Council to adopt the minimum COLA recommendation of the United Church for all staff positions.
- Heather reviewed her on-going work re: pastoral care, planning with Worship and Faith Formation, meeting with Finance and Stewardship and Trustees. She also outlined her main goal for the coming 6 months as being setting the charge up for success after her retirement.
- Patty Lancaster and Rosslyn Bentley met with Lisa Leffler and Rev. Leffler during the summer to update the description for Pastoral Charge Secretary. Heather and Lisa have had a chance to review the draft and make changes. The intent is to bring the description forward to the Board at the November meeting.
- Next meeting will be February 25th, 2026 at 1 pm.

Rockwood Stone Finance & Stewardship

The committee met on October 29 and received a Treasurer's Report from Matt Setzkorn, Pastoral Charge Treasurer; as well as verbal reports from Bill Allen, Stone Treasurer; Amanda Hunter-Anthony, Rockwood's Treasurer; and Jack Ward, Stone Property and Finance Chair.

It was noted that our minister and secretary received the funds not paid to them in 2024 in August.

The Pastoral Charge received \$12,570 from the Manse Fund in the spring and November.

Rosslyn Bentley, M&P Chairperson shared the cost of living increases mandated by the United Church for 2026. It was noted that Western Ontario Waterways Regional Council has mandated \$50 per month for the minister's telephone. Heather is happy with \$40 per month as John has a discount from Rogers.

We are exploring moving the Pastoral Charge phone to VOIP.

Heather shared options for ministry for July to December 2026.

Following our meeting the chairperson, minister and treasurers met with Matt to prepare the 2026 Budget.

Rockwood Property & Finance

Thank you to all who share their time, talents and financial support that enables the church to function. Currently PAR and weekly givings are not keeping up with expenses. We hold Country Breakfasts in September, October, January, February, March, April and May, the proceeds go to the General Fund. Outreach has also given a portion of their fundraising towards the General Fund.

We applied for and received an UpFund Grant to improve Day Hall, with the intention of increasing rentability and accessibility. New lights were installed in the Hall making it a brighter and more welcoming space – and allows programs that do crafts or readings to run with more ease. The walls were mended and painted. New double paned windows were replaced in the west end of the Hall and in the two bathrooms as the old windows were single paned and not energy efficient. Programmable

thermostats were also installed in the hall and the church which allows the temperature to be controlled remotely. A reminder to all those who use the hall and the sanctuary to reserve their times so the heat will be on at appropriate times and to ensure the space is available.

Property and Finance are hoping to increase rentals now that the renovations are complete. There will also be a new fee schedule for rentals coming out shortly.

House of Joy

Thank you to Cees, Kevin, Alex, Jamie, Eric and Christine for all their work on the House. The roof was repaired to ensure that it does not leak over this winter. The leaning chimney was removed, and water damage (fallen ceilings and insulation) was removed. This is with the intention of preserving the state of the house and to prevent further deterioration as we look to sever the lot from the church property in preparation for a sale in the spring.

It has become apparent and was discussed at Council that the market has changed and the parking lot is not as saleable as the House. In the spring, we will be installing steps to the front door on the advice of the Real Estate Agent. Over the winter, an application to sever will be completed. The Real Estate Agent believes the House/House Lot is saleable and proposes it be listed for one week only and take offers. We are looking forward to spring!

With the sale of the House, we will be looking at building 1-2 sheds.

Property Update – Jack Ward

Our takeout dinners this year were well received. A total of 343 dinners were sold. After putting out a sign in front of the church advertising our dinners, we received responses from close neighbours of the church.

Water is tested every 90 days, and we are pleased to report our water is good.

Public Health inspected our kitchen in August and we passed.

Financial Update – Bill Allen

The Stone United Church ended the month of October with an operating surplus of \$3,510.50. This surplus is primarily a result of a very generous legacy gift from the Estate of Evelyn Farr. We are very appreciative of this gift, allowing our church to continue the important faith support for our congregation and our community outreach activities. Fundraising activities also contributed to this surplus, with \$2,350 raised from maple syrup sales and \$5,689.19 from the four take-out dinners on offer.

This is our seventh year for a Canadian Foodgrains Project. To-date we have raised \$4,826 from donations and fundraising activities. We will be closing out our project year with a fundraising breakfast on November 29. Donations are still being accepted until the end of November. Donations can be made by e-transfer to

stoneuc.treasurer@gmail.com or by mailing a cheque to Stone United Church, P.O. Box 57, Rockwood, NOB 2K0. Write "Foodgrains Project" in the memo line. In addition to money raised for this year's project, a decision was made to donate the balance from the Children of Bukati project to the Canadian Foodgrains Bank.

Once again, Stone Church delivered a very successful "Wellness Series" attracting both church and community members to hear presentations on important wellbeing topics. This initiative was supported by a grant from the UPFund.

- We asked the minister and Council chairperson to send a letter of gratitude to our active members, including those members who do not attend worship but give regularly or help with cleaning the church, take out dinners and other activities.
- A second letter was sent to other members telling them that in a world where people are lonely, wanting to belong and seeking meaning we are able to offer caring community, meaning and purpose. People will be invited to remember their time at Stone and asked to send a legacy gift once a year to help us continue to our ministry. They will be encouraged to update their contact information with Karen so that a new minister is able to connect after Heather retires in June.
- A third letter will be modified for people living at a greater distance.
- A final group of 15 people who we have no contact information for or very limited contact with was removed from our membership roll by Council.

The roll will be reviewed again in the spring while we have Heather's knowledge of who has been active in the 14 years of her ministry.

Rockwood Outreach

We are busily preparing for our major fund raiser of the year – the Christmas Market and we have been baking and cooking up a storm. The beautiful fresh greens were harvested yesterday by Cees and are waiting to be converted into festive outdoor arrangements, which can be pre-ordered by contacting Marcia at 519 856 4968 or cmhawort@sentex.net. The event is on Saturday November 22 from 10:30 am until 2 pm and will feature frozen chicken pot pies and fruit pies as well as a large assortment of Christmas goodies, decorations, preserves and crafts. There will be an exciting Silent Auction and a light lunch will be served. We hope to make this the best ever so that we can support the ever-growing number of Rockwood families needing help from the food bank.

In May we held a very successful plant sale in conjunction with Property and Finance. We made \$1,840 of which \$740 was donated to Property and Finance to help with kitchen and hall renovations.

In the fall we made \$100 from holding a Food Fix by auctioning off a meal generously provided by Darlene, Marion, Kay and Phyllis.

We have supported the food bank on many occasions, spending over \$700 purchasing many items for the freezer and we held a back-to-school food drive in August with an overwhelming response from both congregations of children's snacks etc.

It looks as though we may again fall a little short of our target for Mission and Service by year end, but we will be close.

We continue to help support people with gift cards when requested and were able to help a young woman who, after paying her rent was unable to pay for her medications and groceries. \$175 of gift cards and cash solved her problem.

We are sending \$1,000 to Anishnabeg Outreach to help with delivery of Sprit Bundles.

In **February**, we held a Chilli Lunch and Trivia event following our AGM, which was well attended, and very enjoyable; over \$200 was raised to kickstart our project for 2025.

A CFGB Update regarding US Foreign Aid cuts impact, and the Sudan crisis, prepared by Bill, was included in the **March/April** Announcements. We also promoted and attended the **March 27th** Spring Information Meeting at Barrie Hill, with Ontario CFB Coordinator Henry Reinders.

The following CFGB Update on global food insecurity, prepared by Bill, was included in the **August/September** announcements:

A recent report from the United Nations Food and Agriculture Organization updated on the state of global food security and nutrition to 2024. The report indicates an estimated 720 million people globally are facing chronic or severe hunger with the most acute occurring in Africa where 20% of the population is experiencing hunger. The top three drivers of food insecurity, continue to be violent conflict, climate-related disasters and economic instability, the last factor exacerbated by the increase in food costs over the past few years. These numbers do not include the impact of this year's drastic cuts to US funded humanitarian aid programs. The Canadian Foodgrains Bank continues to fund emergency food aid and promotion of conservation agricultural practices. Please consider supporting the CFGB by donating to our Foodgrains Project. Rockwood Trustees

Rockwood Trustees met on August 19th and on September 4th, 2025.

- On August 18th a local developer made an offer to purchase the parking lot land at \$550k. Trustees met to review the offer and counter offered lowering the price to \$600k after approval from the Church Council but noting not to support any additional reduction in profit, having worked out a breakeven minimum price beyond which the sale of the house would be more cost effective than sale of the lot and construction of the new car park.
- The counteroffer was accepted on August 20th and the sale was approved on August 22nd.
- The potential buyer's lawyer advised to finalize the deal only if the church agreed to pay half to cost of the geological survey and any subsequent environmental clean-up. Trustees met on September 4th and taking account of the advice of our Realtor, declined and the sale fell through.
- WOWRC Congregation Support Commission was kept informed of the process throughout.
- Extension Council who continue to hold the mortgage for the house have agreed to continue to hold on any mortgage repayments.
- A letter was sent to WOWRC Congregation Support Commission on October 5th, 2025 seeking permission to list the house and sever the lot the following motion was approved at their October 12th meeting.

“that the Congregational Support Commission of Western Ontario Waterways Regional Council supports the decision of the Board of Trustees of Rockwood United Church to seek severance of the lot containing the manse for the purposes of listing for sale. Listing information to be received once lot is severed.”
